

LOCAL RULES

1. Out of Bounds (Rule 27 – 1)

The areas beyond any perimeter fence or those areas indicated by White Stakes with Black Tops. Staked areas occur on holes 6, 7, 9 and 18. On holes 6, 7 and 18, the OOB is defined by the painted line on the outside edge of the concrete path. The line itself is OOB.

2. Hazards (Rule 26)

Lateral Water Hazards

- Red Stakes

Water Hazards

- Yellow Stakes

Lateral Water Hazards with Blue Stakes

- Drop Zone Option

If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in the water hazard, the player may:

- (i) proceed under Rule 26: or
- (ii) as an additional option, drop the ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.

3. Staked Trees (Rule 24)

If a staked tree interferes with a player's stance or intended swing, the ball must be lifted and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(i) (Immovable Obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

4. Ground Under Repair (Rule 25)

Areas defined by a white line or GUR signage.

5. Garden Beds

Throughout the course, play the ball as it lies.

6. Immovable Obstruction (Rule 24-2)

Relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be obtained under Rule 24-2. In addition, if a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and an immovable obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows: "The ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on the putting green. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

7. Bunkers

All bunkers are to be treated as a hazard and to be played in accordance to Rule 13-1 to 4. Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

8. Abnormal Conditions

Should a ball come to rest in a bunker whilst groundstaff are working within the bunker, the ball is deemed to lie in GUR 'through the green' and the player (without penalty) must drop the ball outside the bunker.

9. Seams of Cut Turf

Through the green, seams of cut turf (not the turf itself) are deemed to be ground under repair. However, interference by a seam with the player's stance is deemed not to be, of itself, interference under Rule 25-1. If the ball lies in or touches the seam or the seam interferes with the area of intended swing, relief is available under Rule 25-1. All seams within the cut turf area are considered the same seam.

10. Distance Measuring Devices

For all play at this course, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. gradient, windspeed, temperature, etc.) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.

Penalty for Breach of Local Rule;

Stroke Play - 2 strokes

Match Play - loss of hole.
